

Project Officer Update Humberto Carvalho	 GPRA Standard of Practice Guidance Defined closed series as all participants are the same, same series with different sessions within the series. Defined open series as different sessions with multiple participants. Requested feedback to identify consistent GPRA reporting guidelines and strategy across network TTCs to result in accurate data. SAMHSA has funded three new Training and Technical Assistance (TTA) Centers of Excellence (CoE) CoE- Behavioral Health Equity LGBTQ – University of Maryland, Baltimore CoE- Behavioral Health Equity African American – Morehouse School of Medicine CoE- Behavioral Health Equity Aging Population – Rush University Medical Center Annual reports are due December 30, 2020 for the period April 2019 to December 29, 2020. SPARS system is set up to retrieve data by fiscal year; include year 2 only. Follow current GPRA series guidelines. Follow 25% carry over rule; more than 25% indicate on the FFR form. Workplan tool found on the HUB will help streamline data for the annual report.


